We have all heard how archers occupied an important place in battle in ancient times. Velusumana was renowned for his archery. In ancient times archers performed another important function. They were employed to send messages to kings. Archers were posted at fixed distances; the messages were tied to an arrow and the arrow with the message was shot from one point to the other point. In this way, messages from distant places were sent to the destination within a short period. These messages contained information about war, enemies, trade etc.

Another common means of communication used by the ancient kings was to employ drummers to pass the messages.

These drummers went around the country announcing the orders issued by the king. Such messages contained information about the administration of the country mostly. In this way, within a few days' time the whole country would get the information.

African tribes along the Congo had a very significant way of communication. They beat drums to pass the message. Different rhythms were used to pass different messages.

Messages such as the death of a tribesman, announcing a forthcoming battle etc. were passed in this way. They had a system of answering or responding to messages sent by the drummers from distant places.

Stone inscription was a means of communication used by ancient kings. The messages were carved on a stone sheet or at the entrance of a cave.

The stone sheets containing information were placed at prominent places so that the people could get the message. These messages were on various topics such as, donations of the kings, the rules and regulations imposed by kings etc.

Galpotha in Polonnaruwa, and the stone inscription pillar at Badulla are classic examples of stone inscriptions. "Ashoka Stampa" in India is another example of a stone inscription.

After the invention of the telephone by Sir Graham Bell in 1876 communication became very much easier. With the help of the telephone people in distant places could be connected within a very short time. Information started flowing from one end of the world to the other end freely, after the telephone was invented.

Soon the wired network was replaced with wireless network. Instead of fixed telephones mobiles started to invade the world. Today, we are in a multimedia world where not only voice but also text and graphics can be sent from one mobile to another.

The ordinary mail system where you can post a letter, or you can send a telegram when you want to communicate was the most popular means of communication until electronic mail came. With the introduction of the internet where you connect computers with the help of telephone, receiving and sending information became very fast. But we have to remember that ordinary mail still remains important where official matters are concerned. It still is the most convenient system of communication for those who cannot to have telephone of internet connections.





"Wake up!" Do you hear these words often? If so, maybe you are not getting enough sleep. What is sleep? Why do people sleep? How much sleep do you need? All people sleep. All mammals and birds also sleep. Some reptiles, amphibians, and fish sleep too. Scientists understand some of the reasons for sleep. But they do not understand everything about it. There are two kinds of sleep in mammals and birds. One kind of sleep is Rapid Eye Movement sleep, which we call REM sleep. The other kind of sleep is Non-Rapid Eye Movement sleep, which we call NREM or non-REM sleep. Dreams occur during REM sleep and the eyes move quickly beneath closed eyelids. During REM sleep, people and animals are paralyzed. Scientists think people enter a state in which they cannot move so they will not hurt themselves while they are dreaming. The National Sleep Foundation in the United States says that 7-9 hours of sleep daily

is best for an adult. Seven to nine hours of sleep is good for memory, alertness, problem -solving, and health. Less than six hours of sleep affects the ability to think. Getting too much sleep may not be good for people either. Too much sleep is linked to sickness and depression.

Babies need a lot more sleep than adults. An infant needs up to 18 hours of sleep each day. A baby spends about nine hours in REM sleep. Five-year-olds need 11-13 hours of sleep each day. A five-year-old spends about 2 hours in REM sleep. Teenagers need 9 - 10 hours of sleep each day. Pregnant women need more sleep than other adults. Many people think that elderly people need less sleep than younger adults, but that is not true. Most adults do well with 7 - 9 hours of sleep.

Scientists are not sure of all the reasons for sleep. They know that sleep helps the body heal and grow. Sleep helps the immune system-which helps people fight disease. Sleep helps the infant brain grow. It seems that REM sleep is especially important for babies' brain growth. It also seems that sleep is a time for processing memories. It is true that people dream while sleeping. Why do we dream? Some scientists believe that dreams are the result of random brain activity during REM sleep.

People sleep in a variety of places, too. Some people sleep on the ground. Some sleep on mats or in beds. Some use pillows, blankets, and other bedding. But they all sleep! Good night! Sweet dreams!

The True Story Of Hachiko,

Man and his dog – it's a friendship as old as time. And one of the most well-remembered stories is the story of the Akita dog named **Hachiko**, and his owner, **Hidesaburo Ueno**. In fact, the dog lived over 100 years ago in Tokyo, Japan, yet his presence is still very much integrated into the city.

Perhaps the reason that the story has stood the test of time, is that it's an example of unconditional love and loyalty.

The two fell into a daily routine where Ueno and Hachi would walk together to the Shibuya train station, where Ueno would pet Hachiko goodbye before getting on the train to work.

Hachi would then spend the day waiting for Ueno to come back. In the meantime, local shopkeepers and station workers would keep an eye on him and often give him treats while he held his vigil for Ueno.

This routine continued for several years until one day, tragedy ensued. Ueno never came home from work as **he** suffered a brain hemorrhage and died. Of course, Hachi had no idea that this, so the loyal dog continued to wait for his owner's return. Every day like clockwork, when the train would appear, so would Hachi – searching for Ueno.

Hachi never gave up home and continued to wait for over 9 years, when Hachiko was found on the morning of March 8, 1935 – deceased due to natural causes. His body was taken to the train station's baggage room – a place that had been one of his favorite hangouts. He was then photographed, surrounded by Ueno's wife, Yaeko, as well as staff members at the station. Yoshizo Osawa, one of the staff members, gifted the photo to one of his daughters. **She** recalled that her dad loved dogs and would often tell her about Hachi and how he'd come daily to the station where staff would happily share their lunches with him

Hachiko's body was preserved and then kept at the National Science Museum of Japan in Tokyo.

A bronze statue of Hachiko was erected outside the Shibuya Station as a tribute to the dog, however, the statue got destroyed in World War II. A new one replaced it in the same exact spot at the end of the war in 1948, and it remains there to this day. The spot has become a popular and beloved neighborhood park.







Cereal such as white rice, and corn lose considerable amount of their natural vitamin content during milling. The enrichment programme specifies amount of four B vitamin (thiamin, riboflavin, niacin and folic acid) and the mineral iron that manufacturers must add to the refined white flour and certain other milled products. At present, health experts are considering whether vitamin B 12 should be included as an enrichment nutrient. Enrichment helps protect people from developing the deficiency diseases associated with the lack of these nutrients. However, enrichment does not replace the Vitamin E, B-6, potassium, magnesium, several other micro nutrients, and fiber that were in naturally in the unrefined grains. This is the major reason dietitians and other nutrition experts promote regular consumption of whole –grain products such as whole wheat bread and brown rice.

Fortification involves the addition during manufacturing of one or more vitamins and other nutrients to a wide array of commonly eaten foods. The vitamins that are added may or may not be in the food naturally. For example, milk is often fortified with vitamin A and D, and many ready-to-eat cereals have additional vitamins baked into or sprayed on them before packaging. In the modern world fortification and enrichment of foods have improved vitamin intake of people. However some food manufacturers add to foods and beverages particularly flavored drinks, that would otherwise be considered "empty calories" items.
